OPPORTUNITY FOR CITIZENS TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL – no citizen input

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON ANY OR ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

Old Business:

A. Sheridan Street options.

At last month's meeting Allan and Debbie Konitzer expressed their concerns with the undeveloped portion of Sheridan Street that runs in front of their home off of Flatley Avenue. Council agreed something needs to be done with this end of Sheridan Street. This item was tabled at the February meeting and instructed to bring back for discussion once the Utility Department completed service to a new home being built along this undeveloped portion of Sheridan Street.

Utility Manager Kuhn informed the utility connections have been completed for the new home and the roadway has been made back into gravel again. The new home is currently being built and their driveway is complete so there is some heavy equipment using the street. Now would be the time to look at a potential cul-de-sac or other options for the street. A road right of way would have to be determined to see if there is enough room for a turn around.

McDermid thought the street should be blacktopped with a cul-de-sac.

Street Superintendent Magnin informed we currently have a 60 foot right-of-way but would need approximately 100 foot right-of-way even though the cul-de-sac would only be 60 foot; this would be with no curb.

Debbie Konitzer reiterated her concerns from last month's discussion regarding the undeveloped street being muddy and wanting it not to be a through street as to deter 4-wheelers and racing vehicles. She would like something done about the mud for now as it may be a while before something can be completed. Street Superintendent Magnin will look into this matter and possibly put more gravel on it and/or grade it for the time being.

City Attorney Jeske will also take a look at the area and talk with property owners who will be affected so he can start working on deeds. He would like to discuss with the new home builders as to where they would like their driveway to be off the street and how close to the cul-de-sac if one is put in.

Street Superintendent Magnin will check into pricing options for both a through street and a culde-sac and bring back to next meeting.

Item tabled ... until property owners can be contacted regarding a right-of-way for possible culde-sac and street pricing options can be gathered.

New Business:

A. 2020 Memorial Weekend Celebration.

Chad Trudell, event chairman for Panther Pride's Memorial Weekend Celebration, gave a rundown of festivities planned for the weekend event. Festivities included the same events as last year with the exception that there will be no bicycle give-a-way this year. Events include the yearly carnival, softball tournaments, fireworks, Dash O.F. Color 5k run/walk, bean bag tournament, music bands, car show, craft vendors, and parade. Trudell informed he has been the chair of this event for the past 15 years and will be stepping down after this year's celebration is done.
