

Bur Oak



Height:	70-80 Feet
Width:	80 Feet
Shape:	Broadly oval, irregular and open
Foliage:	Deep green leaves are 4 to 12 inches long, lobed and shaped like a base fiddle. The beautiful leaf is glossy and smooth above while pale and hairy below.
Flowers:	N/A
Fruit:	Yields acorns that are larger than most others, with a conspicuously fringed cap that extends about halfway down the nut.
Description:	Pyramidal to oval in youth. Develops large trunk and crown.
Fall Color:	Yellow to yellow brown
Advantages:	A tough tree that is tolerant of most soils and withstands drought, wind, extreme cold, pollution and salt.
Site & Culture:	The bur oak grows well in acidic, alkaline, loamy, sandy, well-drained, wet and clay soils. While it prefers moderate moisture, the tree has some drought tolerance.
